Dear Guest

Welcome to the RIT Inn & Conference Center! We are delighted to have you and your pet as our guests. To ensure a comfortable stay for yourself and fellow guests, we would appreciate it if you would please observe the following guidelines:

- The hotel is prepared to accommodate your pet in the room provided that your pet is fully trained, appropriately restrained by you, and that your pet complies with local legislation requirements.
- There is a \$50.00 pet fee required per pet, per stay, for up to seven days. An additional \$25.00 pet fee (per pet) will apply for each additional week. All pet fees are nonrefundable.
- Your pet must be kept on a leash when it is in the Hotel or on Hotel property unless it is in your room.
- Pets cannot be left alone on property at anytime. A current cell phone number must be supplied to the hotel at check in or the animal cannot be permitted to stay
- We regret that pets are not allowed in any public areas of the hotel (i.e. Food and Beverage outlets, Pool area, Business Center, etc.). This exclusion does not apply to Service animals.
- You are responsible for cleaning up after your pet on Hotel property.
- Any disturbances, such as barking, must be curtailed to ensure other guests are not inconvenienced.
- Please contact the Housekeeping Department to arrange for a convenient time for servicing your room as no attempt may be made to enter if there is a pet in the room, unless the owner is present. Service must be performed a minimum of three times per week. The guest or pet owner should be in the room when it is cleaned.

You agree to be responsible for all property damages and/or personal injuries resulting from your pet. You further agree to indemnify and hold harmless the Hotel, its owners and its operator from all liability and damage suffered as a result of your pet. The Hotel reserves the right to charge your account commensurate with the cost of such damages.
